

# **Anglo-Saxons**

KS2 School Session: History, Art

Peterborough as we know it today was founded by the Anglo-Saxons. They built the first church, dedicated to St Peter on the site of the Cathedral, and soon a town sprung up around it. It was called Medehamstede, becoming St Peter's Burgh after the Anglo-Saxons. Our activities are inspired by excavations that took place in Alwalton on the western edge of Peterborough, where an Anglo-Saxon cemetery was discovered.

### **Learning Objectives:**

- To develop enquiry and evidence based learning skills
- To gain an understanding of archaeological skills
- To understand aspects of Anglo Saxon life and the objects they used

#### **Activity 1: Anglo-Saxon Excavation**

Excavate a trench to reveal an Anglo-Saxon woman and the objects she was buried with. The use the objects and other evidence to find out about her life.

#### **Activity 2: Meet an Anglo-Saxon woman**

Meet Aedith, an Anglo-Saxon woman. Find out about her personal possessions and why she needed them.
