

The Tiger Who Came to Tea

(Homes in the Past)

EYFS & KS1 School Session: History

Hear the much loved story of the Tiger who Came to Tea by Judith Kerr in our 1950s kitchen, spotting objects from the book along the way. Role play chores from the Victorian times in our Victorian Kitchen, using original Victorian household objects from the Museum collection. Compare all the different things seen with what the class have in their kitchens!

Learning Objectives:

- To understand how life in the past compares to life today
- To recognise different objects used in the past
- Be able to articulate similarities and differences between the Victorian times, C20th and today

Activity 1: Role play in the Victorian Kitchen

How does a Victorian kitchen and household chores compare to kitchens of today? Find out through role-play; dress up, wash and iron clothes, practise your embroidery, beat the rag rug and sit in a bath in front of the range!

Activity 2: The Tiger who Came to Tea

Our 1950s kitchen room set provides the perfect backdrop to this familiar and much-loved story. Can you spot the objects on display as the story is told?

Activity 3: Make a Tiger Mask

Turn yourself into a tiger by making and decorating a tiger mask!
