

Archaeology

KS2 School Session: History

Archaeology asks the big questions about life and society in the past. It uses objects to discover how people lived in the past and can often challenge pre existing historical evidence. Learn about the process of archaeology with a mock excavation, fieldwalking and sieving, and handle Bronze Age objects.

Learning Objectives:

- Gain an understanding of the archaeological process and what takes place before excavation
- Understand the different methods archaeologists use to understand the past
- Use evidence they have found to draw conclusions about the past

- Using evidence, understand process of change, change and continuity, make historically valid questions, selecting relevant historical information, using a range of sources

Activity 1: Fieldwalking

Find out one of the first steps archaeologists take before digging to discover what could lie underground

Activity 2: Excavation

Excavate a trench and handle archaeologist's tools to discover what you can find out about the past through objects. Layers go from Victorian to Prehistory.

Activity 3: Sieving

See what archaeologists could have left behind by sieving through the soil for small finds. Learn what these small finds tell us about our site.

Activity 4: Bronze Age Handling

Handle replica Bronze Age artefacts based on objects found at Must Farm. Work out what they could be and demonstrate them for the class to guess...
