Peterborough Museum has a large selection of toys dating back from Victorian times to the 1970s which we can bring out to your school - perfect for topics looking at playtime, childhood and materials. This session is adaptable for KS2 looking at the theme of play and leisure time.

Learning Objectives:

- To develop an awareness of the past by identifying and discussing changes in toys and games over time and discuss similarities and differences between old and modern toys and games.
- To develop an understanding of how old toys can help us find out about the past
- To listen and respond to adults and their peers, speaking audibly and fluently when sharing ideas and observations.
- To identify and name a variety of everyday materials that the toys are made of.
- To describe the simple physical properties of each material from looking carefully at the toys
- To identify and compare the suitability of a variety of everyday materials.
- To understand simple forces such as push and pulls when describing how a toy moves.

Activity

A range of toys from the past are looked at, focusing on type, materials, how they work and how they compare with toys within living memory. Then pupils explore further with real and replica toys and games through enquiry-based play and discussion.
